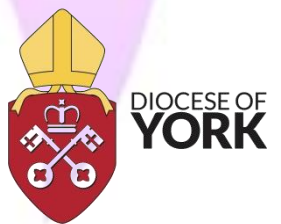

Ephesians 4:14-16

The York School of Ministry Certificate in Theology, Mission and Ministry provides a theological education in and for a variety of contexts, including preparing people for lay and ordained ministry and mission within the church. The programme also serves those who wish to be more fully equipped for Christian life and service in the world, or simply more informed about the Christian faith.

The Certificate is validated and awarded by Durham University under the Common Awards Scheme. It aims to equip Christian disciples and ministers to develop as competent and faithful reflective practitioners and enables students to acquire competence in a range of subject areas at higher education level 4. Running over two years, the programme is delivered via termly 20 credit modules, each comprising up to 12 taught sessions.

For those studying for credit each module includes written assessment, which can take a variety of forms (for example, essays, personal reflections, case studies) depending upon the specific module content, however, there are no written examinations.

Students studying on the programme are normally expected to use their 'home' church or benefice as an ongoing context for reflection, although opportunities for placements and fieldwork in other churches or ministry environments may be included.

Students wishing to gain the Certificate must complete 120 credits. Successful completion of the Certificate enables students to continue to the Diploma Programme, which offers further opportunities to explore subjects in more depth and also introduces new topics.

Cost: For ministry students studying as part of their training, discernment or development please contact YSOM to discuss fee remission.

For students studying independently the cost is as follows:

£100 per module – teaching only

£300 per module – fully accredited module

£30 discount on first module if booked by 1st Aug 2017

The modules: 2017-18: Introduction to the Old Testament
Christian Doctrine and History
Foundations of Christian Worship
2018-19: Introduction to the New Testament
Pastoral Care and Ethics
Mission and Ministry

Entry requirements: The course is accessible to a wide range of people from those with no formal academic qualifications to post graduates.
